Live Your Dream: College Bound

Improving Opportunity Through Education



In 2012, College Bound was developed to encourage third grade students to attend college after high school by providing them with information they may not be exposed to in their typical home and school environments. Students are also provided with an informational presentation that is age appropriate addressing why it is important to go to college, aspects of college life, and goal setting while in their elementary classroom setting before touring the UC Davis campus.

This year we provided two schools in our school district with the College Bound program. Our first school experienced College Bound in the fall. We took our second College Bound school to UC Davis in April. The students really enjoyed the campus tour. Both the students and parents that came on the tour were astonished that we were still on campus when we went to Lake Spafford for lunch.

My group was especially excited to see the UC Davis gymnasts doing flips at Hickey Gym. All of the students were impressed seeing the pole vault and high jump athletes at the track. Some of the students struck up conversations with a young lady who was practicing her running technique. Most of the kids ran a lap around the track as well.

Another student interest was the outdoors art installations throughout the campus, the egg heads in particular. They actually would request to view pieces of art when spotted from afar! I'm glad that were able to experience the different types of art on campus, especially with all of the budget cuts to arts programs throughout California public schools.

We can't wait for President Laura to lead us into the 2015-16 year!





BriAnne Dewberry, chair of the LYD hike, has been working to change our Hike to reflect this new direction of career support.

BriAnne commented, "We are excited to present this new curriculum and to improve the future career success of girls in our community. It provides girls with access to professional role models, career education and the resources to live their dreams."
