I had always wanted to do volunteer work, but it was difficult to find the time with all their commitments. I had never heard of Soroptimist, but after attending a couple of meetings, I knew it was something that I wanted to be involved in. I love everything that Soroptimist stands for.”

When asked how Soroptimist has influenced her life, Tammy commented that “Soroptimist has given me a chance to focus energy towards to improving others’ lives. And not only that, but it has given me a chance to grow as a person by allowing me to take leadership roles. I’ve never been a person to like the spotlight and certainly don’t consider myself organized, but I took on the role of President and did a fairly good job. I choose to look at all the things that were accomplished instead of those that I didn’t. It has certainly given me more confidence, and I will just keep stepping outside the comfort zone.”

## College Bound- Improving Opportunity through Education

After a successful program launch in October of 2012, SI Woodland's College Bound committee is looking forward to hosting another event and welcoming another group of students. The project, which sprang from concern that local students were unaware of potential career and possible higher learning opportunities available to them; SI Woodland developed this program to address this potential deficit.

On a beautiful fall morning, third grade students from Whitehead Elementary in Woodland were taken on a field trip to the University of California, Davis and participated in curriculum to broaden their horizons so that they could be "college bound" in the future.

In small groups the students rotated through four stations, covering various topics, all designed to spark an interest in pursuing higher education: why go to college, social aspects of college, how your interests relate to occupations and college courses, and goal setting.

After the rotation to all stations was complete, students had lunch in the quad area. Students then returned to their small groups and were taken on a brief tour of the campus.

In order to measure the success of the project, students completed questionnaires both before, and after the program. Prior to their visit with SI Woodland to UC Davis, 61% of the students strongly agreed that college was important for a successful job. After their morning with the College Bound Committee and other SI Woodland members, 85% of the students strongly agreed that college was important for a successful job. Furthermore, before participating in College Bound, 54% of the students strongly agreed that their teachers expect them to go to college. After our program, 73% of the students strongly agreed that their teacher expected them to go to college.

The committee is now developing and planning a second College Bound program for this program year.



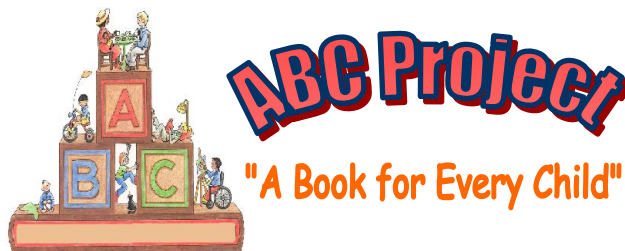
## ABC Project: A Book for Every Child - Supporting Literacy in Our Community

The 2013-2014 ABC Committee has kicked off the start of the new program year with a bang! As summer ended and Woodland abandoned swimming pools in favor of the classrooms, the committee made a generous donation of books to the Woodland United Way. The donation, made during the kick-off event for the organization's 2013 LIVE UNITED Campaign, was an essential component of the United Way Annual Book Drive. The Woodland United Way has begun a new education initiative promoting literacy, a fundamental right that SI Woodland and the ABC Committee have been dedicated to for more than a dozen years.

While inventorying the books SI Woodland has had left over from years of donations throughout the community, the committee has also agreed to divide excess elementary and middle school reading level books between the Yolo County Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence Center and 4<sup>th</sup> & Hope. These books will be placed in safe houses and service centers, to provide distraction to anyone in need. Various Spanish-language books were also discovered in the surplus, and the committee has chosen to donate these books to Beamer Elementary School and their Spanish immersion program.

In looking further into this program year, the ABC Committee continues to plan its large scale Kindergarten book donation program. The committee and various SI Woodland members visit each kindergarten program in the Woodland Joint Unified School District each spring and provide every child with a book to take home.

The ABC Committee was formed in 2005 and is deeply committed to improving the literacy of all children, regardless of their location or socioeconomic status. It is the belief of the committee that all children must be able to read properly if they have any chance of being successful in life. The committee and SI Woodland are happy, and will continue, to provide opportunities for literacy throughout the community.
